As a leader, you need to be able to clearly and succinctly explain to your employees everything from organizational goals to specific tasks. - Clarity
- Concision

Unit 2. Motivation

Leaders need to inspire their workers to go the extra mile for their organizations; just paying a fair salary to employees is typically not enough inspiration (although it is important too). There are a number of ways to motivate your workers: you may build employee self-esteem through recognition and rewards, or by giving employees new responsibilities to increase their investment in the company.

Leaders must learn what motivators work best for their employees or team members to encourage productivity and passion. Skills related to effective motivation include:

- · Allowing employee autonomy
- · Asking for input
- · Assessing the interests of staff
- Convincing

Unit 3. Delegating

Leaders who try to take on too many tasks by themselves will struggle to get anything done. These leaders often fear that <u>delegating</u> tasks is a sign of weakness, when in fact it is a sign of a strong leader.

Therefore, you need to identify the skills of each of your employees, and assign duties to each employee based on his or her skill set. By delegating tasks to staff members, you can focus on other important tasks. Some skills that make a good delegator include:

- · Accepting feedback from employees
- · Allotting resources for employees

- Assessing employee strengths and weaknesses
- Defining expectations

Unit 4. Positivity

A positive attitude can go a long way in an office. You should be able to laugh at yourself when something doesn't go quite as planned; this helps create a happy and healthy work environment, even during busy, stressful periods.

Simple acts like asking employees about their vacation plans will develop a positive atmosphere in the office, and raise morale among staff members.

If employees feel that they work in a positive environment, they will be more likely to want to be at work, and will therefore be more willing to put in the long hours when needed. Some skills that help make for a positive atmosphere in the workplace include:



What is Perfume Extraction?

Fragrance extraction refers to the separation process of aromatic compounds from raw materials, using methods such as distillation, solventextraction, expression, sieving, or enfleurage. The results of the extracts are either essential oils, absolutes, concretes, or butters, depending on the amount of waxes in the extracted product.

To a certain extent, all of these techniques tend to produce an extract with an aroma that differs from the aroma of the raw materials. Heat, chemical solvents, or exposure to oxygen in the extraction process may denature some aromatic compounds, either changing their odour character or rendering them odourless, and the proportion of each aromatic component that is extracted can differ.

Types of Perfumes:

Perfume types reflect the concentration of aromatic compounds in a solvent, which in fine fragrance is typically ethanol or a mix of water and ethanol. Various sources differ considerably in the definitions of perfume types. The intensity and longevity of a perfume is based on the concentration, intensity, and longevity of the aromatic compounds, or perfume oils, used. As the percentage of aromatic compounds increases, so does the intensity and longevity of the scent. Specific terms are used to describe a fragrance's approximate concentration by the percent of perfume oil in the volume of the final product. The most widespread termsare:

- <u>Perfume or extract</u>, in English known as perfume extract, pure perfume, or simply perfume: 15–40% aromatic compounds.
- <u>esprit de parfume</u> (ESdP): 15–30% aromatic compounds, a seldom used strength concentration in between EdP and perfume;
- <u>eau de parfume</u> (EdP) or parfum de toilette (PdT) (The strength usually sold as "perfume": 10–20% aromatic compounds (typically ~15%); sometimes called "eau de perfume" or "millésime"; parfum de toilette is a less common term, most popular in the 1980s, that is generally analogous to eau de parfum;
- <u>eau de toilette</u> (EdT): 5-15% aromatic compounds (typically ~10%); This is the staple for most masculine perfumes.
- <u>eaudeCologne</u> (EdC): often simply called cologne: 3–8% aromatic compounds (typically ~5%); see below for more information on the confusing nature of the term "cologne";
- <u>eaufraiche</u>: products sold as "splashes", "mists", "veils" and other imprecise terms. Generally these products contain 3% or less aromatic compounds and are diluted with water rather than oil or alcohol.

There is much confusion over the term "cologne", which has three meanings. The first and oldest definition refers to a family of fresh, citrus-based fragrances distilled using extracts from citrus, floral, and woody ingredients. Supposedly these were first developed in the early 18th century in Cologne, Germany, hence the name. This type of "classical cologne" describes unisex compositions "which are basically citrus blends and do not have a perfume parent." Examples include Mäurer & Wirtz's, and Guerlain's Eau de Cologne impériale.

In the 20th century, the term took on a second meaning. Fragrance companies began to offer lighter, less concentrated interpretations of their existing perfumes, making their products available to a wider range of customers. Guerlain, for example, offered an eau de Cologne version of its flagship perfume **Shalimar**. In contrast to classical colognes, this type of modern cologne is a lighter, diluted, less concentrated interpretation of a more concentrated

product, typically a pure parfum. The cologne version is often the lightest concentration from a line of fragrance products.

Finally, the term "cologne" has entered the English language as a generic, overarching term to denote a fragrance worn by a man, regardless of its concentration. The actual product worn by a man may technically be an eau de toilette, but he may still say that he "wears cologne". A similar problem surrounds the term "perfume", which can be used in a generic sense to refer to fragrances marketed to women, whether or not the fragrance is actually an extrait.

Classical colognes first appeared in Europe in the 17th century. The first fragrance labeled a "parfum" extract with a high concentration of aromatic compounds was Guerlain's Jicky in 1889. Eau de toilette appeared alongside parfum around the turn of the century. The EdP concentration and terminology is the most recent. Parfum de toilette and EdP began to appear in the 1970s and gained popularity in the 1980s.

Types of Extraction:

a) Organic solvent extraction

Organic solvent extraction is the most common and most economically important technique for extracting aromatics in the modern perfume industry. Raw materials are submerged and agitated in a solvent that can dissolve the desired aromatic compounds. Commonly used solvents for maceration/solvent extraction include hexane, and dimethylether.

In organic solvent extraction, aromatic compounds as well as other hydrophobic soluble substances such as wax and pigments are also obtained. The extract is subjected to vacuum processing, which removes the solvent for re-use. The process can last anywhere from hours to months. Fragrant compounds for woody and fibrous plant materials are often obtained in this matter as are all aromatics from animal sources. The technique can also be used to extract odorants that are too volatile for *distillation* or easily denatured by heat. The remaining waxy mass is known as a concrete, which is a mixture of essential oil, waxes, resins, and other lipophilic (oil-soluble) plant material, since these solvents effectively remove all hydrophobic compounds in the raw material. The solvent is then removed by a lower temperature distillation process and reclaimed for re-use.

Although highly fragrant, concretes are too viscous — even solid — at room temperature to be useful. This is due to the presence of high-molecular-weight, non-fragrant waxes and resins. Another solvent, often ethylalcohol, which only dissolves the fragrant low-molecular weight compounds, must be used to extract the fragrant oil from the concrete. The alcohol is removed by a second distillation, leaving behind the absolute. These extracts from plants such as jasmine and rose, are called absolutes.

Due to the low temperatures in this process, the absolute may be more faithful to the original scent of the raw material, which is subjected to high heat during the distillation process.

b) Supercritical fluid extraction

Supercritical fluid extraction is a relatively new technique for extracting fragrant compounds from a raw material, which often employs supercritical CO2 as the extraction solvent. When carbondioxide is put under high pressure at slightly above room temperature, a supercriticalfluid forms (Under normal pressure CO2 changes directly from a solid to a gas in a process known as sublimation.) Since CO2 in a non-polar compound has low surface tension and wets easily, it can be used to extract the typically hydrophobic aromatics from the plant material. This process is identical to one of the techniques making decaffeinated coffee.

In supercriticalfluid extraction, high pressure carbondioxide gas (up to 100 atm.) is used as a solvent. Due to the low heat of process and the relatively unreactive solvent used in the extraction, the fragrant compounds derived often closely resemble the original odour of the raw material. Like solvent extraction, the CO₂ extraction takes place at a low temperature, extracts a wide range of compounds, and leaves the aromatics unaltered by heat, rendering an essence more faithful to the original. Since CO₂ is gas at normal atmospheric pressure, it also leaves no trace of itself in the final product, thus allowing one to get the absolute directly without having to deal with a concrete. It is a low-temperature process, and the solvents are easily removed. Extracts produced using this process are known as CO₂ extracts.

c) Ethanol extraction

Ethanol extraction is a type of solvent extraction used to extract fragrant compounds directly from dry raw materials, as well as the impure oils or concrete resulting from organic solvent extraction, expression, or enfleurage. Ethanol extracts from dry materials are called *tinctures*, while ethanol washes for purifying oils and concretes are called *absolutes*.

The impure substances or oils are mixed with ethanol, which is less hydrophobic than solvents used for organic extraction, dissolves more of the oxidized aromatic constituents (alcohols, aldehydes, etc.), leaving behind the wax, fats, and other generally hydrophobic substances. The alcohol is evaporated under low-pressure, leaving behind absolute. The absolute may be further processed to remove any impurities that are still present from the solvent extraction.

Ethanol extraction is not typically used to extract fragrance from fresh plant materials; these contain large quantities of water, which will be extracted into the ethanol, although this is sometimes not a concern.

d) Expression

Raw natural material, often citrus, is placed on a large plate. A top plate is then pressed down on the raw materials squeezing them tightly until their natural essences are pressed out. Sometimes the plates contain pins to prick the skin of a citrus rind and release the essences held within. The plates are spun so that the essential oils are completely removed from their material which is left pressed between the plates. The result is an ESSENTIAL OIL. Types of raw material created in this way include Mandarin, Tarocco Orange and most citrus fruits. This is the easiest way to extract natural essence meaning that they are usually found in the top notes and first impressions of a fragrance as they have the shortest life span on the skin.

e) Stem distillation

A natural ingredient, often herbs or flowers is placed on top of water in a large copper distilling still, more water is then added and the materials mix in with the water, the water is then heated releasing the aroma of the ingredient into steam. The steam rises in the vat and through a collection of pipes is transported to another still where it will slowly cool. Once collected and cooled, the fragranced oil collected during the heating process and water layers naturally separate resulting in an essential oil, which is then removed from the water, the remaining slightly scented water can also be used in the food and drink industry. AIM:

THEORY:

Liberalization and globalisation of the economy has accelerated growth and speed of income and wealth and made India the 4th largest economy in the world on the basis of Purchasing Power Parity. This will augment the markets for perfumery, cosmetics and allied industries. This in turn will also require trained and competent manpower. The course is tailor made to meet this growing requirement.

HISTORY:

The word perfume derives from the Latin perfumare, meaning "to smoke through". Perfumery, as the art of making perfumes, began in ancient Mesopotamia, Egypt, the IndusVallevCivilization and possibly AncientChina. It was further refined by the Romans and the Arabs. The world's first-recorded chemist is considered to be a woman named Tapputi, a perfume maker mentioned in a cuneiform tablet from the 2nd millennium BC in Mesopotamia. She distilled flowers, oil, and calamus with other aromatics, then filtered and put them back in the still several times. On the Indiansubcontinent, perfume and perfumery existed in the Induscivilization (3300 BC – 1300 BC).

In 2003, archaeologists uncovered what are believed to be the world's oldest surviving perfumes in Pyrgos, Cyprus. The perfumes date back more than 4,000 years. They were discovered in an ancient perfumery, a 300-square-meter (3,230 sq ft) factory housing at least 60 stills, mixing bowls, funnels, and perfume bottles. In ancient times people used herbs and spices, such as almond, coriander, myrtle, coniferresin, and bergamot, as well as flowers. In May 2018, an ancient perfume "Rodo" (Rose) was recreated for the Greek National Archaeological Museum's anniversary show "Countless Aspects of Beauty", allowing visitors to approach antiquity through their olfaction receptors.

In the 9th century the <u>Arabchemist Al-Kindi</u> (Alkindus) wrote the Bookof the Chemistry of Perfume and Distillations, which contained more than a hundred recipes for fragrant oils, salves, aromatic waters, and substitutes or imitations of costly drugs. The book also described 107 methods and recipes for perfume-making and perfume-making equipment, such as the <u>alembic</u> (which still bears its Arabic name. [from <u>Greek</u> "cup", "beaker"] described by <u>Synesius</u> in the 4th century).

The Persian chemist Ibn Sina (also known as Avicenna) introduced the process of extracting oils from flowers by means of distillation, the procedure most commonly used today. He first experimented with the rose. Until his discovery, liquid perfumes consisted of mixtures of oil and crushed herbs or petals, which made a strong blend. Rosewater was more delicate, and immediately became popular. Both the raw ingredients and the distillation technology significantly influenced western perfumery and scientific developments, particularly chemistry. The art of perfumery was presumably known in western Europe from 1221, taking into account the monks' recipes of Santa Maria delle Vigne or SantaMariaNovella of Florence, Italy. In the east, the Hungarians produced around 1370 a perfume made of scented oils blended in an alcohol solution – best known as HungaryWater' – at the behest of QueenElizabethofHungary.

The art of perfumery prospered in Renaissance Italy, and in the 16th century the personal perfumer to Catherinede'Medici (1519-1589), René the Florentine (Renato il florentino), took Italian refinements to France. His laboratory was connected with her apartments by a secret passageway, so that no formulae could be stolen en route. Thanks to Rene, France quickly became one of the European centers of perfume and cosmetics manufacture. Cultivation of flowers for their perfume essence, which had begun in the 14th century, grew into a major industry in the south of France.

Between the 16th and 17th centuries, perfumes were used primarily by the wealthy to mask <u>bodyodors</u> resulting from infrequent bathing. In 1693, Italian barber Giovanni Paolo Feminis created a perfume water called Aqua Admirabilis, today best known as <u>cologne</u>; his nephew <u>JohannMariaFarina</u> (Giovanni Maria Farina) took over the business in 1732.

By the 18th century the <u>Grasse</u> region of France, <u>Sicily</u>, and <u>Calabria</u> (in Italy) were growing aromatic plants to provide the growing perfume industry with raw materials. Even today, Italy and France remain the center of European perfume design and <u>trade</u>.

Perfume Classification

Perfumes can be classified according to the "Fragrance wheel" which simplifies fragrance classification and naming scheme. This method was invented in 1983 by Michael Edward, British fragrance expert.

Fragrance notes are an elements of a method of describing a perfume. They describe scents that can be sensed when the perfume is applied to the skin. They are divided into three classes according to the scents that can be sensed in different periods of time after the application and can be top (or head) notes, middle (or heart) notes, and base notes.

Top notes:

Top notes are those smells that can be sensed immediately after perfume is applied. Ingredients that give off these notes consist of small molecules that evaporate quickly. These notes are very important for selling the perfume because they give is the first smell that costumer senses when buying the perfume. For top notes are used scents of basil, eucalyptus, bergamot, cajeput, cinnamon, clary sage, grapefruit, lemon, tangerine, coriander, spearmint, thyme and others.

Middle notes:

Middle notes are appear when top notes start dissipating. They make the major smell of the perfume together with the base notes and can be chosen to cover the base smell that can sometimes be unpleasant at the beginning. These notes are usually more mellow and can appear in the smell somewhere between two minutes and one hour after the perfume is applied. Scents used to give middle tones to perfumes are scents of pine, cardamom, lavender, rosemary, juniper, chamomile, marjoram, nutmeg and even black pepper.

Base notes:

It bring depth and solidity to a perfume and their odor lasts the longest. They appear when middle tones start disappearing and can last up to 24 hours. Molecules of ingredients that are used for base notes evaporate very slowly and their scent are usually rich and strong. To give these strong scents to perfumes, perfumers use myrrh, frankincense, rose, vanilla, ginger, clove, and cedarwood as well as other.

Perfumes themselves are generally classified into two groups:


- 1) Traditional perfumes

Traditional perfumes appeared at the beginning of the 20th century and it has following subcategories:

- Single Floral (or soliflore): perfumes that have a dominant scent of just one flower.
- Floral Bouquet: perfumes whose scent is a combination of several flowers.
- Oriental or Amber: these have sweet and slightly animalic scents.
- Woody: made of agarwood, sandalwood, cedarwood, and vetiver which give of woody scents.
- Leather: scents that are reminiscent of leather but made of scents of honey, tobacco, wood and wood tars.
- Chypre: called after the perfume of the same name that they resemble in scent and which was made in 1917 by François Coty, French perfumer and businessman (and fascist). They use scents of bergamot, oakmoss, and labdanum.
- Fougère (French for "fern"): has sharp herbaceous and woody scent resembling of fern. Has base of lavender, coumarin and oakmoss and is predominantly men's perfume.

Modern perfumes started appearing after 1945 with inventions in synthesis and compound design:

- Bright Floral: combination of the traditional Single Floral and Floral Bouquet groups.
- Green: a subgroup of a Chypre group which has an emphasis on scents of cut grass, crushed green leaf and cucumber.
- Aquatic, Oceanic, or Ozonic: appeared in 1980s. It uses calone for its base which is a synthetic scent which has marine and ozone nuances discovered in 1960s.
- Citrus: large fragrance family with a citrus base. Consists mainly of "freshening" eau de colognes.
- Fruity: perfumes that have scents of fruits that are not citruses for instance peach, cassis (black currant), mango, passion fruit, and others.
- Gourmand: perfumes with scents resembling "edible" or "dessert" flavors vanilla, tonka bean and coumarin for instance.



Raw Materials:

Natural ingredients—flowers, grasses, spices, fruit, wood, roots, resins, balsams, leaves, gums, and animal secretions—as well as resources like alcohol, petrochemicals, coal, and coal tars are used in the manufacture of perfumes. Some plants, such as lily of the valley, do not produce oils naturally. In fact, only about 2,000 of the 250,000 known flowering plant species contain these essential oils. Therefore, synthetic chemicals must be used to re-create the smells of non-oily substances. Synthetics also create original scents not found in nature.

Some perfume ingredients are animal products. For example, castor comes from beavers, musk from male deer, and ambergris from the sperm whale. Animal substances are often used as fixatives that enable perfume to evaporate slowly and emit odors longer. Other fixatives include coal tar, mosses, resins, or synthetic chemicals. Alcohol and sometimes water are used to dilute ingredients in perfumes. It is the ratio of alcohol to scent that determines whether the perfume is "eau de toilette" (toilet water) or cologne.

The Manufacturing Process:

Collection

Before the manufacturing process begins, the initial ingredients must be brought to the manufacturing center. Plant substances are harvested from around the world, often hand-picked for their fragrance. Animal products are obtained by extracting the fatty substances directly from the animal. Aromatic chemicals used in synthetic perfumes are created in the laboratory by perfume chemists.

Extraction:

Oils are extracted from plant substances by several methods: steam distillation, solvent extraction, enfleurage, maceration, and expression.

- In steam distillation, steam is passed through plant material held in a still, whereby
 the essential oil turns to gas. This gas is then passed through tubes, cooled, and
 liquified. Oils can also be extracted by boiling plant substances like flower petals in
 water instead of steaming them.
- Under solvent extraction, flowers are put into large rotating tanks or drums and benzene or a petroleum ether is poured over the flowers, extracting the essential oils. The flower parts dissolve in the solvents and leave a waxy material that contains the oil, which is then placed in ethyl alcohol. The oil dissolves in the alcohol and rises. Heat is used to evaporate the alcohol, which once fully burned off, leaves a higher concentration of the perfume oil on the bottom.
- During enfleurage, flowers are spread on glass sheets coated with grease. The glass sheets are placed between wooden frames in tiers. Then the flowers are removed by hand and changed until the grease has absorbed their fragrance.
- Maceration is similar to enfluerage except that warmed fats are used to soak up the flower smell. As in solvent extraction, the grease and fats are dissolved in alcohol to obtain the essential oils.
- Expression is the oldest and least complex method of extraction. By this process, now used in obtaining citrus oils from the rind, the fruit or plant is manually or mechanically pressed until all the oil is squeezed out.

Blending:

• Once the perfume oils are collected, they are ready to be blended together according to a formula determined by a master in the field, known as a "nose." It may take as many as 800 different ingredients and several years to develop the special formula for a scent. After the scent has been created, it is mixed with alcohol. The amount of alcohol in a scent can vary greatly. Most full perfumes are made of about 10-20% perfume oils dissolved in alcohol and a trace of water. Colognes contain approximately 3-5% oil diluted in 80-90% alcohol, with water making up about 10%. Toilet water has the least amount—2% oil in 60-80% alcohol and 20% water.

Aging:

• Fine perfume is often aged for several months or even years after it is blended. Following this, a "nose" will once again test the perfume to ensure that the correct scent has been achieved. Each essential oil and perfume has three notes: "Notes de tete," or top notes, "notes de coeur," central or heart notes, and "notes de fond," base notes. Top notes have tangy or citrus-like smells; central notes (aromatic flowers like rose and jasmine) provide body, and base notes (woody fragrances) provide an enduring fragrance. More "notes," of various smells, may be further blended.

Quality Control:

Because perfume's depend heavily on harvests of plant substances and the availability of animal products, perfumery can often turn risky. Thousands of flowers are needed to obtain just one pound of essential oils, and if the season's crop is destroyed by disease or adverse weather, perfumeries could be in jeopardy. In addition, consistency is hard to maintain in natural oils. The same species of plant raised in several different areas with slightly different growing conditions may not yield oils with exactly the same scent.

Problems are also encountered in collecting natural animal oils. Many animals once killed for the value of their oils are on the endangered species list and now cannot be hunted. For example, sperm whale products like ambergris have been outlawed since 1977. Also, most animal oils in general are difficult and expensive to extract. Deer musk must come from deer found in Tibet and China; civet cats, bred in Ethiopia, are kept for their fatty gland secretions; beavers from Canada and the former Soviet Union are harvested for their castor.

Synthetic perfumes have allowed perfumers more freedom and stability in their craft, even though natural ingredients are considered more desirable in the very finest perfumes. The use of synthetic perfumes and oils eliminates the need to extract oils from animals and removes the risk of a bad plant harvest, saving much expense and the lives of many animals


